Flight Training Update for 2021

This year, as many years in the past, the Cincinnati Silent Flyers (CSF) will be offering free flight training to people interested in learning how to fly radio control model aircraft.

Ever since the CSF was chartered back in 2003, one of our founding principles was promoting and educating people in model aviation. In the beginning, we had 1 or 2 instructors. Now, we have over a half dozen club members who volunteer their time and equipment to train student pilots. This allows someone new to the hobby to have a "hands on" flying experience with a big "safety net" of a trained instructor always working with them.

So, how can our members help with this? Even if you are not entirely comfortable working with a student pilot on a buddy box, you can still contribute to making their first flying experience a great one. Just showing up on training nights with your own airplane (or two or three) gives the students an opportunity to see the scope of the hobby. Just seeing the wide variety of RC aircraft available might keep someone interested in the hobby.

Also, as time allows, be willing to fly your aircraft so the students can observe how different aircraft perform in the air. To be clear, our first priority on training night is to get our students as much "air time" as possible. However, there is always some opportunity between student flights to fly your own aircraft.

Importantly, always be willing to greet and speak with someone new to our airfield. This goes a very long way to making them feel welcomed. At the end of the evening always invite them to return again.

This year, our target training night will be on Monday evenings beginning on April 5. In the event of weather not conducive to training, we'll push back to Wednesday evening. I will try to give everyone as much advance notice as possible via email. S please be sure that we have your most current email on file.

Field Maintenance Update

Hello Pilots!

Wow, am I ever looking forward to flying again this year! I hope that each of you are as well and we really look forward to seeing each of you again this year.This year, we will be continue to maintain our field at a high level. We are always interested in getting your feedback if there is something we can do to improve your flying experience at the club. Just email me or any club officer.

Over the next few weeks, we will be adding some new flight stands, new windsock and a club flag to our field. Our mowing plan for 2021 will remain the same as in past years. We do plan to seal coat the asphalt runway again this year. We will do this as soon as the field dries out and the contractor can access the field without damaging it to do this work. Exact timing of this work has not been established but I suspect it will be late May or early June before we complete this work. Meanwhile, the runway is still perfectly serviceable for your use.

Our leadership team really tries to keep any requests for member maintenance support to a bare minimum. Our goal is for our CSF members to spend their free time flying not doing field work. We only ask your help in a couple of areas:

1) If you find trash of any kind on the field, at the entrance or along the driveway, please take a minute and pick it up and dispose of it properly.

2) We can also always use your help in removing any large sticks or branches from the areas we mow. If you can take a few minutes to just pick them up and toss them in the woods or in the fire pit then this really helps protect the mowing equipment.

Safety Officer Update

Hello fellow CSF members!

First, let's deal with the big issue of maintaining personal safety at the field during the pandemic. This is actually very simple and not difficult to achieve. If you feel sick or have tested positive for Covid-19 then please stay at home. Put in some time on your flight simulator and come back to the field when you are well.

While at the field, if you want to wear a mask then this is fine. A lot of members do wear a mask even though it is easy to maintain social distance when flying. If you don't want to wear a mask then don't - totally your option.

Your best bet to be able to maintain social distancing is to stay out of the hangar area

by charging your batteries at home before you arrive.

We all forget at times so if someone approaches you too closely then let them know that you prefer to maintain a safe distance.

But know that you can still come out to CSF and fly safely.

From an FAA regulations standpoint, the rules are still evolving. Here is what you need to know today to be within AMA and FAA compliance:

1) Do not fly above 400'. This is the current FAA maximum altitude permitted for unmanned aircraft (which is the category covering RC aircraft).

2) Register with the FAA and make sure that your aircraft bears your the FAA number that you were issued on the outside of the aircraft. We can show you how to get the registration completed when you come to the field if you have any questions. It is really very easy!

3) Always maintain visual line of sight with your aircraft. Even when flying FPV you have to maintain your aircraft within line of sight.

4) Read and follow AMA rules. This is important because failure to do so could negate the liability insurance coverage that comes with your FAA membership.

Familiarize yourself with the rules posted at the field. If you have questions then just ask.
